**Wellness Payment Plan Addition:
Oral Evaluation and Treatment**

In 2026, Care Animal Hospital is happy to announce the option to include an Oral Evaluation and Treatment procedure within your pet's Wellness Payment Plan. Routine dental procedures for animals can carry a substantial cost, so we are adding the option to split up the majority of this cost into monthly payments like we are doing with other annual preventative care.

Unlike people, our pets cannot brush their own teeth or visit a dental hygienist every 6 months. Plaque forms on the teeth in as little as 24 hours. Without being brushed off, it can form into a substance called calculus and eventually tartar. This substance is a yellow/brown material consisting of food particles and bacteria. It is often first noticed due to the odor it produces and the stained appearance of the teeth. If left untreated, this bacterium can travel throughout the bloodstream, affecting the liver, kidneys and heart. It is estimated that 80% of dogs have a form of periodontal disease by the age of two. Our goal is to treat the early stages in order to prevent progression of the more advanced stages. With early detection and treatment, our pets will live longer and happier lives!

Our "Wellness OET" option can be added to any Adult or Senior Wellness Payment Plan. Every patient's mouth is different, so the core costs of the procedure are paid for across the 12-month period of the Wellness Payment Plan, while variable costs such as any needed Oral Surgery or Additional Anesthesia Time would be paid for at the time of the procedure. Variable costs will be reviewed and discussed with you by the Doctor scheduling the procedure.

Core Dental Procedure:

- Oral Evaluation and Treatment: This procedure consists of probing the gumline for any pockets, checking mobility of the teeth, charting any abnormal spaces or damaged teeth, plaque or tartar removal (scaling), and finally polishing of the teeth
- Pre-surgical Bloodwork: Reviews current organ function to determine if your pet is healthy enough to be placed under anesthesia
- Administration of and First 30 minutes of anesthesia gases: Every patient is monitored continuously by a licensed technician while placed under general anesthesia. This process includes injections, intubation, and constant review of bodily functions such as heart rate, temperature, and oxygen levels. Also includes I.V. Fluid administration and preparing the patient for their procedure.
- Digital Dental Radiograph: 2/3rds of the tooth is covered by the gumline. Radiographs help determine if the roots and other surrounding structures are healthy, even if no abnormalities are seen above the gumline.

These basics can typically add up to ~\$800. When added to a Wellness Payment Plan these core portions of the procedure are discounted down to \$700. This \$700 is then broken down into 12 monthly payments of \$58.33 and added onto the base fee of your pet's Wellness Payment Plan. The resulting amounts are listed below for your quick reference.
